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CHECK YOUR TENSION

Before you start working on a pattern, make sure that the end-result will be perfect by making a swatch.

You've got to make sure that your knitting tension is exactly the same as the tension in our pattern. If it isn't, your garment is likely to be too big or too small.

HOW TO MAKE A SWATCH?

Using the yarn, needles, and stitch specified for the pattern, work a square at least 6 in (15 cm) on a side.

Iron the square lightly on the wrong side under a damp cloth or using a steam iron. If the swatch is worked in ribbing, stretch it slightly. With a ruler, count the sts to equal 4 in (10 cm) widthways and 4 in (10 cm) lengthways.

Compare the result with the sample given in our instructions.

Your tension square matches ours!

You can start your knitting, you can be sure your project will have the same dimensions as the grid.

Your sample has more stitches and rows?

Your knitting is too tight. Make another swatch with needles one size larger.

Your sample has fewer stitches and rows?

Your knitting is too loose. Make another swatch with needles one size smaller.

When your swatch matches ours, you're ready to follow the instructions. You can expect to end up with a garment that's just right.

BEWARE: It is important to achieve an exact number of stitches for the design to fit correctly. However, the number of rows can be adapted depending on the height indicated in cm.



Read the instructions

Before you start knitting we advise you to read through the instructions, trying to imagine all of the steps you will be taking. All patterns are well detailed.

The instructions are given for several sizes. We suggest that you circle or underline the numbers that correspond to the size you intend to make. If there's only one number, it applies to all the sizes.

BASIC KNITTING STITCHES


1/1 rib

Cast on an uneven number of stitches.

Row 1: knit 1, purl 1, and repeat these 2 stitches to the last stitch, knit 1.

Row 2 and subsequent rows: purl over the purl stitches, knit over the knit stitches.

Repeat these 2 rows.



2/2 rib


Cast on a multiple of 4 stitches + 2 (e.g., 22 stitches).

Row 1: knit 2, purl 2, and repeat to the last stitches,

knit 2.

Row 2 and subsequent rows: purl over the purl stitches, knit over the knit stitches.

Repeat these 2 rows.




Seed or moss stitch

Cast on an uneven number of stitches.

Row 1 : knit 1, purl 1, repeat these 2 stitches.

Row 2 and subsequent rows: purl over knit stitches, knit over purl stitches.



Corn stitch

Cast on an uneven number of stitches.


Row 1 : knit 1, purl 1, repeat these 2 stitches, ending with knit 1.

Row 2: purl over purl stitches, knit over knit stitches.

Row 3: purl over knit stitches, knit over purl stitches.

Row 4: purl over purl stitches, knit over knit stitches.


Repeat these 4 rows.




Yarn forward

By bringing the yarn forward you add a stitch and make an eyelet.


Bring the yarn in front of the work then over the right-hand needle.



Work the next stitch on the left-hand needle. The yarn forward loop forms an extra stitch with a hold at its base on the right-hand needle.




Next row: When you come to the yarn forward loop, purl it as you would any other stitch; you now have 1 extra stitch.




Knit 2 together


Put the right needle through the 2nd then the 1st stitch on the left hand



Knit the 2 stitches together (wrap yarn around right hand needle and pull through the 2 stitches on the left needle).




By knitting 2 stitches together you will have 1 less stitch on the needle..



Slipped stitch

With the yarn at the back of the work, insert the right-hand needle into the next stitch from right to left, as if to purl. Slip the stitch on to the right-hand needle and continue working as given.






Single decrease

Slip a stitch on to the right-hand needle as if to knit.
Knit the next stitch.

Using the left-hand needle, pass the slipped stitch over the stitch you just worked.

After working a single decrease, you have 1 less stitch on the needle.




Double decrease

Slip a stitch on to the right-hand needle as if to knit.
Knit the next 2 stitches together.

Using the left-hand needle, pass the slipped stitch over the 2 stitches you just worked.

After working a double decrease, you have 2 fewer stitches on the needle.








Twisted knit stitch

Knit the stitch, inserting the needle through the back loop to twist the new stitch.



Twisted purl stitch

Purl the stitch, inserting the needle under the back lops to twist the new stitch.



Nonstitch or suppressed stitch


Sometimes, the number of stitches varies from row to row in a pattern; the nonstitches or suppressed stitches are represented by black squares on the chart. When you follow the chart, do not try to work the black squares but go directly to the next square.

Working in reverse

When instructed on the front of a garment, for example a jacket, to work the other front in reverse. If you increased or decreased at the beginning of a right side row on the first front you must increase or decrease at the end of the right side row on the second front at the same measurement. The positions of the stitches used will also be reversed, if you ended with a ribbed section for a border on the first front you will start with the ribbed section on the second front. However the pattern should remain the same (do not reverse a cable twist for example).

Double decrease slip slip knit

Slip 2 stitches as if to knit. Knit 1. Pass the 2 slipped stitches over the stitch just worked..




Raglan decreases

This method of decreasing is always used for Raglan sleeves. It forms a line of slanting stitches parallel with the seam. The decrease is worked with the right side facing, one or more stitches from the edge.

The example shows decreases 1 stitch from the edge:

At beginning of row, with right side facing, knit 1, slip 1, knit 1, pass slipped stitch over (See above).

Continue the row as indicated. When 3 sts are left on the left-hand needle, knit the next 2 sts together (see knit 2 together, page 7), knit the last stitch.






Increases within a row

When you need to increase a stitch in a row you will need to work twice into one stitch.

Put your right needle through the loop of the stitch below the current stitch on your left needle, knit into this stitch.



Work the stitch on your left needle as normal.




You will have one more stitch.

Increases 1 stitch in from edge of row


These increases are always done on the right side of work, 1 stitch in from the edge.

At the beginning of the row, on the right side of work, knit 1 stitch, put the right needle under the horizontal thread before the first stitch on left needle.





Put this strand onto the left needle.


Knit into the back of this loop to twist it.




This prevents a gap forming at the bottom of the increased stitch. Continue along the row.










Increases of one stitch or more at end of work

Wrap yarn around the needle at the beginning of the row as many times as you need stitches. If you are increasing at each end you will also need to do at the end of the row.



Work these stitches as knit or purl in the pattern required.



Stretch cast-on

Short Row Shaping Short rows are rows which are not worked in their entirety, this gives a curve to the work as more rows are completed on one side than the other. They can be used on just one side of work or both sides, creating a gentle slope instead of the stepped edge created by casting off a series of

When told to turn the work during the progress of a row you will not work the remaining stitches on the left hand needle.

To avoid creating a hole when you turn the work, after turning, with the yarn at the front of work (as if about to purl), slip the 1st stitch on the left hand needle onto the right hand needle as if to purl, then take yarn back to back of work (called a wrap) & work the remaining stitches as normal.

When you have finished the short row shaping and need to knit across the whole row you need to knit together the wrap & the next stitch. Take the wrapped stitch back over the top of next stitch then knit both together.

Stretch cast-on

Take a ball of varn in a contrasting colour and cast on half the required number of stitches plus 1 extra.

For example: If the pattern tells you to cast on 45 stitches, using the contrasting yarn cast on

45 + 1 = 23 stitches.

Now, using the yarn you intend to work the pattern with, work as follows:

Row 1: * knit 1, bring yarn forward under the needle, yarn over *. Repeat from * to *. End with knit 1.

Row 2: Slip the first stitch as if to purl on to the right-hand needle, *pass yarn to back, knit 1 (= yarn forward loop from previous row), bring yarn forward, slip next stitch as if to purl *. Repeat from * to *.

Row 3: * knit 1, yarn forward, slip 1 stitch as if to purl, pass yarn to back *. Repeat from * to *. End with knit 1. Continue working in 1/1 rib, beginning Row 1 with purl 1. After completing the ribbing, pull out the contrasting yarn.

Casting off stitches

1) To form armholes or collar


You must cast off stitches at the beginning of rows:

On the right side of work, slip 1 stitch onto the right needle as if to purl. Knit the following stitch.

Using the left needle pass the slipped stitch over the top of the 2nd stitch on the right hand needle. You have cast off 1 stitch.


Knit the next stitch and pass stitch on right needle over the top, you have cast off a 2nd stitch. Repeat this step for the required number of stitches. On the following row, on the wrong side of work, cast off in the same way but work the stitches as purl stitches.

On the following row, cast off the next number of stitches indicated in the pattern to obtain a sloped edge.










2) When work is complete, to cast off all stitches.

Start to cast off as for casting off at the beginning of row: Slip the 1st stitch, knit the following stitch. With the left needle, pass the slipped stitch over the top of the knitted stitch.

Knit the next stitch and with the left needle, pass the 1st stitch on needle over the top of the current stitch. One stitch remains on right needle.




Repeat this sequence until all stitches from the left needle have been worked and only one stitch remains on right needle. Cut thread 10 cm from work and pull through remaining stitch using needle.



Small buttonholes

For a small buttonhole, one stitch is sufficient to make a buttonhole:




Yarn over needle, then knit 2 together.
On the next row work the yarn over needle as normal.



Buttonholes

1st row: Work to where the buttonhole should be, cast off the number of sts indicated in the pattern and work to end of row.

2nd row: Work to cast off sts, cast on the same number of sts as 1st row and work to end of row.



No-cut **buttonholes**

Using a sewing needle, pick up the horizontal strand of the stitch where you want to place the buttonhole, pull it up and attach it 2 rows higher with a few little stitches on the wrong side of the work. Repeat with thehorizontal strand below the first strand, and attach it in the same way 2 rows down.

Pattern **stitches**

Instructions for pattern stitches are always given row by row, as well as in chart form, with each square on the chart representing 1 stitch and 1 row.

The accompanying legend explains the terms and matches the symbols to the stitches. The chart shows the right side of the work, it is not always possible, however, to include all the subtleties of a pattern stitch in a chart. For that reason, we advise you to always read the row-by-row instructions, even if you prefer to use a chart.

Knit over knit and purl over purl is an instruction often used for ribbing and pattern stitches.

Cables

It is easy to work narrow cables over 2 stitches:


Right cross 2: Passing in front of the work, knit the 2nd st on the left-hand needle then knit the first stitch; slip both stitches on to the right-hand needle at once.

Left cross 2: Passing behind the work, knit the 2nd st on the left-hand needle then knit the first stitch as usual; slip both stitches on to the right-hand needle at once.

A cable made up of 3 or more stitches requires the use of a cable needle.


Cable 4 left (front):

Slip 2 stitches on to a cable needle in front of work, knit 2, then slip the 2 stitches from the cable needle on to the left-hand needle and knit 2.



Cable 4 right (back):


Slip 2 stitches on to a cable needle at back of work, knit 2, then slip the 2 stitches from the cable needle on to the left-hand needle and knit 2.




Picking up stitches

When the different sections of the garment are completed, you may need to pick up stitches at the edge of your work, for example on the collar or front borders


To pick up the stitches knit wise, put needle through the middle of each stitch on the last row and pick up the loop. When you are picking up stitches on rows where there are more rows than stitches required work through 2 or 3 rows then skip 1 row to obtain the number of stitches required in the pattern.





Backstitched seam

Place the 2 pieces right sides together. Thread a tapestry needle with the matching yarn, insert the needle through both thicknesses, matching stitch for stitch, and bring the needle out 2 rows further along.



Grafting

This technique is widely used in European patterns, but is not so popular among UK and US knitters. When you have completed the sections, do not cast off, but leave the stitches on a spare needle.

Thread a tapestry needle with the matching yarn. Work with right side facing. Place the 2 spare needles together.

Insert the tapestry needle through the centre of the first stitch on the front needle as if to purl (leave the stitch on the needle),

 and bring the tapestry needle out at the centre of the first stitch on the back needle as if to knit (leave the stitch on the needle).

*bring the tapestry needle through the center of the first stitch on the front needle again as if to knit and slip off the stitch.


- Insert the tapestry needle through the centre of the next stitch on the front needle as if to purl (leave the stitch on the needle).
- bring the tapestry needle out at the center of the next (first) stitch

on the back needle again as if to purl and slip off the stitch,

– Insert the tapestry needle through the centre of the next
stitch on the back needle as if to knit (leave the stitch on the
needle)*, maintaining an even tension. Repeat the movement
until the seam is complete.

Work all the free stitches into the seam one by one and let the stitches drop off the spare needles as they are grafted together.


The finished seam will look identical to a row of knitting.





Invisible seam

Following the sketch, working with the 2 pieces to be joined, pick up the horizontal thread between the first and second stitches and pull firmly to bring the edges together and make the join invisible. If the edge is very uneven, work the thread between the second and third stitches.



You may also use an invisible seam to join at the shoulder. In that case, pick up the 2 upright strands of a stitch 1 row in from the edge.

Fair Isle

Fair Isle and contrasting colour patterns.

These patterns are worked in stocking stitch using several colours to make a design shown on a chart.]

Each square on the chart represents 1 stitch and 1 row. A legend accompanying the chart indicates the colours. Read the chart beginning at the bottom row, from right to left for the right side of the work, and from left to right for the wrong side rows.

KNITTED PATTERNS

Various techniques are used according to the complexity of the pattern.

- When the motifs of the design are small and close together, vou may let the varn not in use run loosely at the back of the work. Make sure that you don't pull the yarn taut or it will pucker the pattern.
- When the motifs are far apart or very wide, pass the yarn not in use behind the work attaching it along with the one that is in use: hold the varn not in use in your left hand, then work a stitch passing the right-hand needle under that yarn but taking care not to actually knit the yarn. Repeat this movement every other stitch.
- When the motifs are very large or use several colours, do no try to pass the varn at the back of the work. Instead, use several balls of each colour, as needed, using the intarsia technique. Each time you change yarn colour, make sure that you twist the yarns loosely at the back of the work to avoid forming holes in the texture.

In all three cases, take care to work evenly, especially where the colours change and stitches tend to be loose.

EMBROIDERED PATTERNS


Embroidery can be used to advantage instead of knitted patterns when the motifs are made up of relatively few stitches.

This technique avoids the problems of disposing of extra yarns at the back of the work. For embroidery, form open chain stitch with a tapestry needle, working from right to left.


Bring the needle from wrong side to right side at the base of the first stitch, insert the needle from right to left under both strands of the stitch above the one being worked (see sketch no. 1), then insert the needle again at the base of the stitch being worked and being it out at the base of the next stitch (see sketch no. 2).

Use this technique to embroider the number of stitches indicated. After the last stitch, bring the needle out at the base of the row above. Turn the work to start again from right to left.







Grafting a border

When the border is finished, work a few rows of stocking stitch using a contrasting yarn.

Take the work off the needle and press the stocking stitch section with a warm iron under a damp cloth to prevent it from unraveling. Pin the border to the finished garment, matching the stitches. Unravel all but the last row of stocking stitch. Now graft the stitches, waving the tapestry needle in and out, and unravel the last row of stocking stitch as you go. Bring the needle from back to front through the centre of the second stitch, work a back stitch into the first stitch and bring the needle out again at the centre of the third stitch: now work a backstitch again into the second stitch and continue thus with backstitching as far as the last stitch.



Chainstitch shoulder seam

CHAINSTITCH SHOULDER SEAMS

or 3 needles cast off or 3 needles bind off

Leave the remaining shoulder stitches on a spare needles. Place back and front with wrong sides together.

Using a third needle, knit together the first stitch from the front needle with the first from the back needle, and repeat with the second stitch fro each needle. You now have 2 stitches on the right-hand needle.

Pass the first stitch over the second, as in casting off. Continue thus until you have cast off all the shoulder stitches. The result is a chain that shows on the right side and a shoulder seam that will not go out of shape. To obtain an invisible seam on the right side, place back and front with right sides together.

8CR: Slip 4 sts to CN at back of work, k the next 4 sts, then k the 4 sts from CN.

8CL: Slip 4 sts to CN in front of work, k the next 4 sts. then k the 4 sts from CN.

4CL: Slip 2 sts to CN in front of work, k the next 2 sts, then k the 2 sts from CN.

4CR: Slip 2 sts to CN at back of work, k the next 2 sts, then k the 2 sts from CN.

2CR: (See "Knitting: Stitches/Techniques/Tips"). **2CL:** (See "Knitting: Stitches/Techniques/Tips").

Stitches used

GARTER STITCH (G. st), using 3.5 mm needles.

STOCKING STITCH (St st) and REVERSE STOCKING STITCH (Rev St st), using 3.5 mm needles.

CABLE A , using 3.5 mm needles. Worked over 12 sts.

Row 1 (RS) and 3: k.

Row 2 and all even rows: $\boldsymbol{p}.$

Row 5: 8CR, k4.

7 and 9: k.

Row 11: k4, 8CL.

Row 13: k.

After row 16, rep from Row 5.

CABLE B, using 3.5 mm needles. Worked over 4

Row 1 (RS): k.

Row 2 and all even rows: k.

Row 3: 4CL.

Row 5: k.

Row 7: 4CR.

Row 9: k.

After Row 10, rep from Row 3.

HONEYCOMB PATTERN (Honeycomb patt) using 3.5 mm needles. Worked over 4 sts.

Row 1 (RS): k.

Row 2 and all even rows: p.

Row 3: 2CR, 2CL.

Row 5: k.

Row 7: 2CL, 2CR.

Row 9: k.

After Row 10, rep from Row 3.

CABLE C, using 3.5 mm needles. Worked over 4 sts.

Row 1 (RS): k.

Row 2 and all even rows: p.

Row 3: 4CR. Row 5: k.

Row 7: 4CL.

Row 9: k.

After Row 10, rep from Row 3.

CABLE D, using 3.5 mm needles. Worked over 12 sts.

Row 1 (RS) and 3: k.

Row 2 and all even rows: p.


Row 5: k4, 8**CL.**

Row 7 and 9: k.

Row 11: 8**CR,** k4.

Row 13 and 15: k.

After Row 16, rep from Row 5.



Tension/Gauge

To achieve a good result, it is essential to make a tension square (See "Check Your Tension" instructions at beginning of book).

24 sts and 31 rows in St st = 10 cm (4 in) square

To make

TUNIC BACK:

Cast on 98-106-112-120 sts.

Work even in G. st for 5 cm (2 in) [20 rows].

Change to St st and dec at each end, 2 sts in from edge as foll:

4 years: 1 st 10 times every 8th row, 1 st twice every 6th row.

6 years: 1 st 5 times every 10th row, 1 st 7 times every 8th row.

8 years: 1 st 12 times every 10th row.

10 years: 1 st 7 times every 12th row, 1 st 5 times every 10th row.

To dec 1 st, 2 sts in from edge: k2, k2 tog, cont row until 4 sts rem on left needle, sl1, k1, psso, k2.

Cont and work even on the rem **74-82-88-96** sts until piece measures **37-42-47-52** cm (**14**½-**16**½-**18**½-**20**½ in) [**120-136-150-166** rows] total.

Raglan:

Cast off 2-2-2-3 sts at the beg of the next 2 rows.

Then dec at each end, 2 sts in from edge as foll: **4 years:** 1 st 5 times every 4th row, 1 st 13 times every 2nd row,

6 years: 1 st 3 times every 4th row, 1 st 18 times every 2nd row.

8 years: 1 st 4 times every 4th row, 1 st 19 times every 2nd row,

10 years: 1 st 3 times every 4th row, 1 st 22 times every 2nd row,

but meanwhile, when work measures 47-53-59-65 cm (18½-20¾-23¼-25½ in) [150-170-188-206 rows] total, change to G. st.

Once you have worked the last raglan dec, for **neck** cast off the rem **34-36-38-40** sts kwise on WS.

FRONT:

Cast on 98-106-112-120 sts.

Work even in G. st for 5 cm (2 in) [20 rows].

Cont as foll:

- 28-32-35-39 sts in St st,
- 3 sts in Rev St st,
- 12 sts Cable A and inc 3 sts evenly spaced across 1st row (see placement on chart),
- 3 sts in Rev St st,
- 4 sts Cable B and inc 2 sts evenly spaced across 1st row.
- 3 sts in Rev St st.
- 4 sts in Honeycomb patt and inc 2 sts evenly spaced across 1st row,
- 3 sts in Rev St st,
- 4 sts Cable C and inc 2 sts evenly spaced across 1st row.
- 3 sts in Rev St st,
- 12 sts Cable D and inc 3 sts evenly spaced across 1st row,
- 3 sts in Rev St st.
- -28-32-35-39 sts in St st.

Work on the 110-118-124-132 sts obtained and dec at each end as for back, then cont on the rem 86-94-100-108 sts until piece measures 37-42-47-52 cm (14½-16½-18½-20½ in) [120-136-150-166 rows] total.

Raglan:

Cast off 2-2-2-3 sts at the beg of the next 2 rows.


Then dec at each end as foll, 2 sts in from edge:

4 years: 1 st 5 times every 4th row, 1 st 10 times every 2nd row,

6 years: 1 st 3 times every 4th row, 1 st 15 times every 2nd row,

8 years: 1 st 4 times every 4th row, 1 st 16 times every 2nd row,

10 years: 1 st 3 times every 4th row, 1 st 19 times every 2nd row,



but meanwhile, when work measures 45-51-57-63 cm (17¾-20-22½-24¾ in) [144-164-182-200 rows] total, change to G. st, but on 1st row dec 3 sts evenly spaced above Cables A and D, 2 dec above Cables B and C and the Honeycomb patt.

Once you have completed the last raglan dec, for **neck** cast off the rem **40-42-44-46** sts kwise on WS.

LEFT SLEEVE:

Cast on 59-65-69-75 sts.

Work even in G. st for 3 cm (11/4 in) [12 rows]. Cont as foll:

- 22-25-27-30 sts in St st,
- 3 sts in Rev St st,
- 12 sts Cable A and inc 3 sts evenly spaced across 1st row (see placement on chart),
- 3 sts in Rev St st,
- 22-25-27-30 sts in St st.

Cont on the 62-68-72-78 sts obtained until piece measures 3.5 cm ($1\frac{1}{4}$ in) [14 rows] total.

Raglan:

Cast off 2-2-2-3 sts at the beg of the next 2 rows.

Then dec on right edge as for back, at the same time on left edge as for front, but meanwhile, when work measures 11.5-12.5-13.5-14.5 cm (4½-5-5½-5¾ in) [38-42-46-48 rows] total, leave on hold on left edge every 2nd row: 9 sts twice, 8 sts once.

Then place back all sts on needle and end in G. st, cont the dec at each end and working 3 dec evenly spaced above cable on **1st** row.

Once you have completed the last raglan dec, cast off the rem 21 sts kwise on WS.

RIGHT SLEEVE:

Work as for left sleeve, reversing shaping of raglan.

FINISHING:

Sew rhinestones to center front, inside the hollow sections of Honeycomb patt: 1st one in last but one honeycomb on neck side, the next ones separated each by one honeycomb in between each rhinestone.

Join raglans.

Sew sleeve seams and sides of tunic.

Secure and weave in ends.

BUTTONED COWL

Cast on 37 sts.

Work as foll until piece measures 49-51-53-55 cm (191/4-20-203/4-211/2 in) [152-158-164-170 rows]:

- 2 sts in G. st,
- 3 sts in Rev St st. 12 sts Cable A.
- 3 sts in Rev St st. 12 sts Cable A.
- 3 sts in Rev St st, 2 sts in G. st.

Work k3, k2 tog 4 times, yo (= 1 buttonhole), k2 tog 8 times, yo (= 1 buttonhole), k2 tog 3 times, k4.

K 2 rows on the rem 24 sts.

Row 2: p6, p1 tbl, p6 (= 13 sts).

Row 3: k2, sl1, k1, psso, k2, k1 tbl, k2, k2 tog, k2 (= 11 sts).

Row 4: p5, p1 tbl, p5 (= 11 sts).

Row 5: k1, s11, k1, psso, k2, k1 tbl, k2, k2 tog, k1 (= 9 sts).

Row 7: sl1, k1, psso, k2, k1 tbl, k2, k2 tog (= 7 sts).

Row 8: p3, p1 tbl, p3 (= 7 sts).

Row 9: k3, k1 tbl, k3 (= 7 sts).

Row 10: p3, p1 tbl, p3 (= 7 sts).

Cont and work even on the **98-106-116-128-140** sts obtained until piece measures **38-39-39-40-41** cm (**15-15**½-**15**½-**15**½-**16** in) [**124-126-126-130-132** rows] total.

Armholes:

Cast off at the beg of every row as foll (1-st dec are worked 3 sts in from edge):

S: 3 sts twice, 2 sts twice, 1 st 6 times.

M: 3 sts twice, 2 sts twice, 1 st 8 times.

L: 3 sts twice, 2 sts 4 times, 1 st 6 times.

XL: 3 sts 4 times, 2 sts 4 times, 1 st 8 times.

XXL: 4 sts twice, 3 sts twice, 2 sts 6 times, 1 st 10 times.

Cont and work even on the rem **82-88-96-100-104** sts until piece measures **55-57-59-61-63** cm (21½-22½-23¼-24-24¾ in) [176-182-188-194-200 rows] total.

Shoulders and neck:



M: 3 sts 4 times, 2 sts twice, 1 st 28 times, 2 sts twice, 3 sts 4 times and the rem 16 sts.

L: 3 sts 4 times, 2 sts 4 times, 1 st 28 times, 2 sts 4 times, 3 sts 4 times and the rem 16 sts.

XL: 3 sts 4 times, 2 sts 6 times, 1 st 26 times, 2 sts 6 times, 3 sts twice, 4 sts twice and the rem 16 sts.

XXL: 4 sts twice, 3 sts 4 times, 2 sts 4 times, 1 st 26 times, 2 sts 4 times, 3 sts 4 times, 4 sts twice and the rem 16 sts.

COLLAR:

Using 3.0 mm needles, cast on **129-133-137-141-145** sts

Work in 1/1 Rib for 3 cm (11/4 in) [12 rows] and leave all sts on hold.

FINISHING:



10 years: 3 sts 4 times, 2 sts 6 times, 1 st 8 times, 2 sts 6 times, 3 sts 4 times and the rem 22 sts.





- 4 sts Cable B. 5 sts in Rev St st.
- * 12 sts Cable C, 5 sts in Rev St st,
- 4 sts Cable A, 5 sts in Rev St st,
- 4 sts in Honeycomb patt. 5 sts in Rev St st.
- 4 sts Cable B, 5 sts in Rev St st *,
- work once more from * to *,
- then 12 sts Cable C, 5 sts in Rev St st,
- 4 sts Cable A, 6-8-10-12-14 sts in Rev St st.

Work p2 tog twice in each group of p sts (= 24 decreases).

Work even for 3 rows on the rem 106-110-114-118-122 sts.

Next row: p2 tog in each group of p sts and k2 tog in each cable and honeycomb (= 23 decreases).

Please note, when it's no longer possible to cross the sts of the various st patterns, replace the cables and Honeycomb by St st.

Work even for 3 rows on the rem 83-87-91-95-99 sts

Next row: p2 tog in each group of p sts and k2 tog in each group of k sts (= 23 decreases).

Work even for 3 rows on the rem 60-64-68-72-76 sts.

Next row: k2 tog in each group of k2, k2 tog twice in each group of k10 (= 14 decreases).

Work even for 3 rows on the rem 46-50-54-58-

Next row: p 2-4-6-8-10 sts, p2 tog, * k2, k2 tog, k2, k2 tog, 3 times p2 tog, p1 *, work once more from * to *, then k2, k2 tog, k2, k2 tog, p2 tog, p 2-4-6-8-10 sts (= 14 decreases).

Work even for 1 row on the rem 32-36-40-44-48 sts

Next row: p2 tog in each group of p sts and k2 tog twice in each group of k sts (= 12 decreases).

Work even for 1 row on the rem 20-24-28-32-36 sts.

Next row: k2 tog to end of row (= 10-12-14-16-18 decreases).

Work even for 1 row on the rem 10-12-14-16-18 sts.

Next row: k2 tog to end of row.

Thread yarn end through the rem 5-6-7-8-9 sts, pull tight and secure end.

Sew seam of hat.

Secure and weave in ends.

BACK:

Cast off at the beg of every row as foll:

Cont on the rem 50-54-58-62 sts until piece measures 38-43-44-49 cm (15-17-171/2-191/4 in) [90-102-104-114 rows] total.

Shoulders and neck:

Cast off at the beg of every row as foll:

4 years: 5 sts 6 times,

8 years: 5 sts twice, 6 sts 4 times,

10 years: 6 sts 6 times,

at the same time when working 1st shoulder dec, cast off the 10-12-14-16 center sts.

Cont each side separately and cast off on neck side every 2nd row: 3 sts once, 2 sts once.

RIGHT FRONT:

Using 4.5 mm needles and 2 strands of A, cast on 33-35-37-39 sts.

Cast off on left edge as for back.

Neck:

When piece measures 35-40-40-45 cm (13%-15%-15%-17% in) [82-94-94-104 rows] total, cast off on right edge every 2nd row: 3-4-5-6 sts once, 2 sts once, 1 st 3 times.

Shoulder:

Cast off on left edge as for back.

LEFT FRONT:

Using 4.5 mm needles and 2 strands of A, cast on 33-35-37-39 sts.

Work in 2/2 Rib for **4.5** cm (**13**4 in) [**12** rows], starting with k2.

Change to 5.0 mm needles, work in striped St st but dec 1 st on 1st row for sizes 4 years, 6 years and 8 years (= 32-34-36-39 sts).

Armhole:

Cast off on right edge as for back.

Neck:

Cast off on left edge as for right front.

Shoulder:

Cast off on right edge as for back.

SLEEVES:

Using 4.5 mm needles and 2 strands of A, cast on **38-38-42-42** sts.

Work in 2/2 Rib for 4.5 cm (134 in) [12 rows].

Change to 5.0 mm needles, work in striped St st but dec 2 sts evenly spaced on 1st row for size 8 years only (= 38-38-40-42 sts).

Work even until piece measures 7 cm (2¾ in) |18 rows] total.

Inc at each end, 2 sts in from edge:

Top of sleeve:

Cast off at the beg of every row as foll:

4 years: 3 sts twice, 2 sts 4 times, 1 st 6 times, 2 sts 6 times, 3 sts twice and the rem 14 sts.

6 years: 3 sts twice, 2 sts 6 times, 1 st 4 times, 2 sts 6 times, 3 sts twice and the rem 14 sts.

8 years: 3 sts twice, 2 sts 6 times, 1 st 8 times, 2 sts 6 times, 3 sts twice and the rem 14 sts.

10 years: 3 sts 4 times, 2 sts 4 times, 1 st 8 times, 2 sts 4 times, 3 sts 4 times and the rem 14 sts.

COLLAR:

Using 4.5 mm needles and 2 strands of A, cast on **70-74-82-86** sts.

Work in 2/2 Rib for **4.5** cm (**1%** in) [**12** rows] and leave all sts on hold.



Leave on hold the 26-28-31-33 sts obtained.

Right leg:



Neck and shoulders:

Work **7-8-9-10** sts, cast off the next **15-15-17-19** sts and work row to end.

Continue each side separately and work in G. st for **10** rows on the remaining **7-8-9-10** sts.

Cast off all sts knitwise on WS.

FINISHING:

Sew side seams and crotch of romper shorts.

Attach 1 button centered on each front shoulder, 1 cm (3/4 in) in from top edge.

Secure and weave in ends.

K 5 rows on the remaining 31-34-37-40 sts.

Next row, work: k1, * k2 together, k1*, repeat from * to *.

K 3 rows on the remaining 21-23-25-27 sts.

Next row, work: k1, then k2 together to end of row.

K 1 row on the remaining 11-12-13-14 sts.



Armholes:

Cast off at the beginning of every row: 2 sts 4 times. 1 st 4 times.

Continue and work even on the remaining 49-55-59-65 sts until piece measures 21-23-26-29 cm (81/4-9-101/2-111/2 in) [90-100-112-126 rows] total.

Shoulders and neck:

For shoulders cast off at the beginning of every row as follows:

1 month: 5 sts 6 times.

3 months: 5 sts twice, 6 sts 4 times,

Continue on the **24-26-28-30** sts obtained until piece measures **11-13-15-17** cm (**4**½**-5-6-6**¾ in) [**48-58-66-74** rows] total.

Increase on right edge 2 sts once.

Continue for beginning of body on the 26-28-30-32 sts obtained until piece measures approximately 14-17.5-21-24 cm (5½-6¾-8½-9½ in) [62-78-92-106 rows] total.

Make a 1-st buttonhole, 2 sts in from edge as follows: k2, yarn over and k2 together (= the buttonhole) and work row to end.

Work as set until piece measures approximately 20.5-24.5-28.5-32.5 cm (8-9½-11¼-12¾ in) [90-108-126-144 rows] total, make 1 buttonhole as previously.

Work as set until piece measures approximately 27-31-36-41 cm (10¾-12¼-14-16 in) [118-138-160-182 rows] total. Make 1 buttonhole as previously.

Work as set until piece measures 29-33-38-43 cm (11½-13-15-17 in) [128-146-168-188 rows] total.

Beginning of right sleeve:

Increase on left edge every 2nd row:

Newborn: 8 sts once, 9 sts once, 12 sts once

1 month: 7 sts twice, 8 sts once, 12 sts once

3 months: 7 sts 4 times, 12 sts once

6 months: 5 sts 5 times, 6 sts once, 12 sts once.

Continue on the **55-62-70-75** sts obtained until piece measures approximately **33.5-38.5-43.5-49.5** cm (131/4-15-17-191/2 in) [146-168-194-220 rows] total.

Make 1 buttonhole as previously.

Work as set until piece measures **34-39-45-51** cm (**13**½**-15**½**-17**¾**-20** in) [**150-172-198-224** rows] total.

Neck:

Cast off on right edge 9-9-10-11 sts once.

Continue on the remaining 46-53-60-64 sts until piece measures 37-42-48-54 cm (14½-16½-19-21¼ in) [164-186-212-238 rows] total.

Top of right sleeve, shoulder and back neck:

On right edge cast on 15-15-17-19 extra sts for back neck.

Then leave on hold the 61-68-77-83 sts obtained.

LEFT FRONT:

Left leg:

Using A, cast on 17-19-21-23 sts.

Work in G. st and increase on left edge as for right leg.

Continue even on the 24-26-28-30 sts obtained until piece measures 11-13-15-17 cm ($4\frac{4}{5}-6-6\frac{4}{9}$ in) [48-58-66-74 rows] total.


Increase on right edge 2 sts once.

Continue for the beginning of body on the 26-28-30-32 sts obtained until piece measures 29-33-38-43 cm ($11\frac{1}{2}$ -13-15-17 in) [128-146-168-188 rows] total.

Beginning of left sleeve:

Increase on right edge as for right front.

Continue on the 55-62-70-75 sts obtained.



Neck:

Cast off on left edge as for right front.

Continue on the remaining 46-53-60-64 sts until piece measures 37-42-48-54 cm (14½-16½-19-21½ in) [164-186-212-238 rows] total.

Top of left sleeve and shoulder:

Leave all sts on hold, but do not cut yarn.

BACK:

Place back on one needle the **61-68-77-83** sts left on hold for right front, then the **46-53-60-64** sts left on hold for left front.

Continue on the **107-121-137-147** sts obtained until piece measures **7-7.5-8-8.5** cm (234-3-3-31/4 in) [32-34-36-38 rows] since starting the back.

End of sleeves:

Cast off at the beginning of every row as follows:

Newborn: 12 sts twice, 9 sts twice, 8 sts twice.

1 month: 12 sts twice, 8 sts twice, 7 sts 4 times

3 months: 12 sts twice, 7 sts 8 times

6 months: 12 sts twice, 6 sts twice, 5 sts 10 times.

Beginning of body:

Continue on the remaining 49-53-57-61 sts until piece measures 26-29-33-37 cm (10½-11½-13-14½ in) [116-128-146-164 rows] since starting the back.

Legs:

Cast off the center st. Continue each side separately and decrease on crotch side, 2 sts in from edge:

Newborn: 1 st 7 times every 6th row.

1 month: 1 st once every 8th row, 1 st 3 times every 6th row, 1 st 3 times every 8th row.

3 months: 1 st once every 10th row, 1 st 6 times every 8th row.

6 months: 1 st once every 10th row, 1 st 3 times every 8th row, 1 st 3 times every 10th row.

To decrease 1 st, 2 sts in from edge on crotch side:

- at the end of row on crotch side: when you have only 4 sts remaining on left needle work k2 together, k2.
- at the beginning of row on crotch side: work k2,
 k2 together and work row to end.

Continue on the remaining 17-19-21-23 sts until piece measures 37-42-48-54 cm (14½-16½-19-21¼ in) [164-186-212-238 rows] since starting the back.

Cast off all sts knitwise on WS.

FINISHING:

Sew bottom of sleeves, reversing seam along 3 cm (11/4 in) at bottom of sleeves for folded edge.

Sew sides of rompers and crotch.

Attach toggle buttons.

Secure and weave in ends.

HAT

Using A, cast on 71-78-85-92 sts.

Work in G. st for 7-8-9-10 cm (2¾-3-3½-4 in) [32-36-40-44 rows].

Next row, work: k1, * k2 together, k5 *, repeat from * to * (= 10-11-12-13 decreases).

K 5 rows on the remaining 61-67-73-79 sts.

Next row, work: k1, * k2 together, k4 *, repeat from * to * (= 10-11-12-13 decreases).

K 5 rows on the remaining 51-56-61-66 sts.

Next row, work: k1, * k2 together, k3 *, repeat from * to *.

K 5 rows on the remaining 41-45-49-53 sts.

Next row, work: k1, * k2 together, k2 *, repeat from * to *.

K 5 rows on the remaining 31-34-37-40 sts.

Next row, work: k1, * k2 together, k1 *, repeat from * to *.

K 3 rows on the remaining 21-23-25-27 sts.

Next row, work: k1, then k2 together to end of row.

K 1 row on the remaining 11-12-13-14 sts.


Next row, work:

Newborn and 3 months: k1, then k2 together to end of row.

1 month and 6 months: Work k2 together to end of row.

Thread yarn end through the remaining 6-6-7-7 sts, pull tight and fasten off.

Sew back seam of hat.





Stitch used

GARTER STITCH (G. st), using 3.5 mm needles. K all rows.

Tension/Gauge

To achieve a good result, it is essential to make a tension square (See "Check Your Tension" instructions at beginning of book).

22 sts and 44 rows in G. st = 10 cm (4 in) square

To make

CROSSOVER CARDIGAN

Cardigan is made in one piece, starting with right front.

Green arrows on diagram show direction of work.

RIGHT FRONT:

Using A, cast on 33-36-39-44 sts.

Work even in G. st until piece measures 12-13-14-16 cm (4%-5-5 ½-6¼ in) [52-58-62-70 rows] total.

Beginning of armhole and slanted edge:

To mark the beginning of armhole slip a piece of scrap yarn in last st (see diagram), at the same time for slanted edge decrease on right edge, 3 sts in from edge:

Newborn: 1 st 8 times every 2nd row.

1 month: 1 st 8 times every 2nd row, 1 st once every 4th row.

3 months: 1 st 8 times every 2nd row, 1 st twice every 4th row.

6 months: 1 st 12 times every 2nd row, 1 st once every 4th row.

To decrease 1 m. on right edge, 3 sts in from edge:

K3, k2 together and work row to end.

Continue on the **25-27-29-31** remaining sts until piece measures **16-18-20-23** cm (61/4-7-8-9 in) [70-80-88-100 rows] total.

Neck:

On right edge, leave **5-5-6-7** sts on hold, then cast off every 2nd row: 2 sts twice, 1 st 4 times.

Continue on the 12-14-15-16 remaining sts until piece measures 21-23-25-28 cm (81/4-9-10-11 in) [92-102-110-122 rows] total.

After the needles already on needles, cast on 17-17-19-22 extra sts for back neck.

Then leave on hold the 29-31-34-38 sts obtained.

LEFT FRONT:

Using A, cast on 33-36-39-44 sts.

Work even in G. st until piece measures 12-13-14-16 cm (4¾-5-5 ½-6¼ in) [52-58-62-70 rows] total

Beginning of armhole and slanted edge:

To mark the beginning of armhole slip a piece of scrap yarn in first st (see diagram), at the same time for slanted edge decrease on left edge as for right front.

To decrease 1 st on left edge, 3 sts in from edge:

Work row until 5 sts remain on left needle, slip 1 st, k1, pass slipped st over, k3.

Continue on the 25-27-29-31 remaining sts until piece measures 16-18-20-23 cm (61/4-7-8-9 in) [70-80-88-100 rows] total.

Neck

On left edge leave **5-5-6-7** sts on hold, then cast off every 2nd row: 2 sts twice, 1 st 4 times.

Continue on the 12-14-15-16 remaining sts until piece measures 21-23-25-28 cm (81/4-9-10-11 in) [92-102-110-122 rows] total.

Leave all sts on hold, but do not cut yarn.

BACK:

Work even for 1 row on the 12-14-15-16 sts, then slip onto the empty needle the 29-31-34-38 sts left on hold from right front and work them right after the sts from left front.

Continue to work in G. st on the 41-45-49-54 sts obtained until piece measures 7-8-9-10 cm (2%-3-11/4-4 in) [32-36-40-44 rows] after back neck.

End of armholes:

Slip a piece of scrap yarn in first and last st (see diagram) to mark end of armholes and continue in G. st until piece measures approximately 19-

21-23-26 cm (**7**½-**8**¼-**9-10**½ in) [**85-95-103-115** rows] after back neck.

Cast off all sts knitwise on WS.

RIGHT SLEEVE:

Using one needle on RS, slip the needle from left to right through each garter ridge, from the scrap yarn of right front to scrap yarn of back (= green line on diagram).

36-40-44-48 loops on needle = **36-40-44-48** sts obtained.

Using A, cast on 1 st on the empty needle, then k right after that the 36-40-44-48 sts, then cast on 1 extra st right after.

Work even in G. st on the **38-42-46-50** sts obtained until piece measures **2** cm (¾ in) [**8** rows] since starting sleeve.

Decrease at each end, 2 sts in from edge:

Newborn: 1 st 5 times every 8th row, 1 st twice every 6th row.

1 month: 1 st 6 times every 8th row, 1 st twice every 6th row.

3 months: 1 st 8 times every 8th row, 1 st once every 6th row.

6 months: 1 st 9 times every 8th row, 1 st once every 6th row.

To decrease 1 st, 2 sts in from edge: k2, k2 together, continue row until 4 sts remain on left needle, slip 1 st, k1, pass slipped st over, k2.

Continue on the 24-26-28-30 remaining sts until piece measures approximately 13-15-17-19 cm (5-6-63/4-71/2 in) [59-67-77-85 rows] since starting sleeve.

Cast off all sts knitwise on WS.

LEFT SLEEVE:

Using one needle on RS, slip the needle from left to right through each garter ridge from the scrap yarn of back to scrap yarn of left front (= orange line on diagram).

36-40-44-48 loops on needle = **36-40-44-48** sts obtained.

Using A, cast on 1 st on the empty needle, then k right after that the 36-40-44-48 sts, then cast on 1 extra st right after.

Work even in G. st on the 38-42-46-50 sts obtained until piece measures 2 cm (¾ in) [8 rows] since starting sleeve.

Decrease at each end as for right sleeve.

Continue on the 24-26-28-30 remaining sts until piece measures aproximately 13-15-17-19 cm (5-6-634-7½ in) [59-67-77-85 rows] since starting sleeve.

Cast off all sts knitwise on WS.

CLOSING TIES:

Cast on 12-13-14-14 sts.

Work 3 rows in G. st and cast off all sts knitwise on WS.

FINISHING:

Collar: Place on 1 needle the **5-5-6-7** sts left on hold from left front, then the **5-5-6-7** sts left on hold from right front.

Then:

- k 5-5-6-7 sts.
- pick up and k 51-51-53-56 sts along neck edge,
- k **5-5-6-7** sts.

Work in G. st for 4 rows on the 61-61-65-70 sts obtained and cast off all sts knitwise on WS.

Sew the sleeve seams and sides of crossover cardigan.

Attach one end of the closing tie along 1 cm (¼ in) on WS of right front, 8-9-10-12 cm (3-3½-4-4¾ in) in from lower edge.

Attach a button to other end of closing tie.

Sew the holed part of a press stud to WS of closing tie under the button.

Sew the rounded part of the press stud to RS of left front, 8-9-10-12 cm (3-3½-4-4¾ in) in from lower edge near side seam.

Sew the rounded part of 2nd press stud to RS of left front, 1 cm ($\frac{1}{4}$ in) in from beginning of slanted edge.

Sew the holed part of press stud facing the other part, on WS of right front, 3.5-4-4.5-4.5 cm (11/4-11/2-13/4-13/4 in) from side seam.

Buttonholes: On right front, make 2 no-cut buttonholes (See "Knitting: Stitches/Techniques/ Tips"): the 1st one located 1.5 cm ($\frac{1}{2}$ in) in from top of collar, the 2nd one 1.5 cm ($\frac{1}{2}$ in) further.

To wear, cross the right front over the left front, and sew 2 buttons facing the buttonholes on left front.

Secure and weave in ends.

HAT

Using B, cast on 71-78-85-92 sts.

Work in G. st for **7-8-9-10** cm (2¾-**3-3**½-**4** in) [**32-36-40-44** rows].

Next row, work: k1, * k2 together, k5 *, repeat from * to * (= 10-11-12-13 decreases).

K 5 rows on the remaining 61-67-73-79 sts.

Next row, work: k1, * k2 together, k4 *, repeat from * to * (= 10-11-12-13 decreases).

K **5** rows on the remaining **51-56-61-66** sts.

Next row, work: k1, * k2 together, k3 *, repeat from * to *

K 5 rows on the remaining 41-45-49-53 sts.

Next row, work: k1, * k2 together, k2 *, repeat from * to *.

K 5 rows on the remaining 31-34-37-40 sts.

Next row, work: k1, * k2 together, k1 *, repeat from * to *.

K 3 rows on the remaining 21-23-25-27 sts.

Next row, work: k1, then k2 together to end of row.

K 1 row on the remaining 11-12-13-14 sts.

Next row. work:

Newborn and 3 months: k1, then k2 together to end of row.

1 month and 6 months: k2 together to end of row

Thread yarn end through the remaining 6-6-7-7 sts, pull tight and fasten off.

Sew hat seam.
